Museum of the Institute of History and Philology

Since its foundation in 1928, the Institute of History and Philology (IHP) of Academia Sinica has been devoted to interdisciplinary scientific inquiries. The institute seeks to expand the scope of historical research by integrating archaeological, philological, and anthropological approaches.

The Museum of IHP is intended to be a window for communication between the institute and the general public, a space for presenting the Institute's rich scholarly resources.

The Museum defines itself as an "academic museum" by consciously highlighting the scholarly significance of the exhibited artifacts. Its collections also trace the developments and changes of the institute. The Museum reopened in 2002 after its gallery spaces were newly remodeled. These renovations marked the beginning of an ongoing process by which the Museum strives to enhance its capacity as a multi-functional space with professional management, an open platform for creativity and inspiration, and a delightful learning environment for visitors.

Lingnan Fine Arts Museum

Although usually known as a research institution, Academia Sinica has been striving to promote art and culture. In 2002, the institution resigned its interior so as to accommodate the Lingnan Fine Arts Museum after receiving the donation of more than one hundred Lingnan paintings from the well-established Lingnan painter Au Ho-nien. The Lingnan School is famous for innovation in modern Chinese art history; its core values include promoting the regeneration of traditional Chinese painting and developing a modern style by combining the techniques of Western painting and Chinese ink painting. Since the school was named after its region (namely "South of the five mountains" in Chinese), some critics believed that it is more appropriate to call it "School of Compromise" instead, which may suit the artist's pursuit better.

The Lingnan Fine Arts Museum's collection includes works by Ju Lian (the founder of Lingnan School), Gao Jian-fu, Gao Qi-feng and Chen Shu-ren (the three masters of Lingnan School), Au Ho-nien and other Lingnan artists. The Museum features the first professional archive of Lingnan paintings in Taian, witnessing changes in the history of Chinese paintings.

Chien Shih-Liang Memorial Hall

Dr. Shih-Liang Chien was a famous chemist who was appointed as President of National Taiwan University in 1951. During his term as President, he established Taiwan's university alliance enrollment system that served as an excellent framework for higher education in Taiwan.

Dr. Chien was elected as Academician of Academia Sinica in 1964 and served as the fifth President of Academia Sinica in 1970. During his presidency, he established the Institute of American Culture, Institute of Earth Science, Institute of Biological Chemistry, Institute of Information Science and four Preparatory Offices.

In memory of Dr. Chien's academic achievements and contributions to Academia Sinica, the library of the Institute of Chemistry was named Chien Shih-Liang Memorial Hall. The Memorial Hall is open to the public to honor his legacy as the foremost advocate of education, academic research, and technology development in Taiwan.

Biodiversity Research Museum

The Biodiversity Research Museum comprises the "Herbarium" and the "Zoological Research Museum." The main goal of the Museum is to preserve voucher specimens for scientific studies and to document biodiversity on earth. Our collections consist of biological specimens of various taxonomic groups, including approximately 140,000 plants, 37,000 fishes, 3,000 birds and 12,000 invertebrates (cnidarians, annelids, mollusks, arthropods and echinoderms). Among them the fish collection, covering extensive local fish fauna, is the most comprehensive of its kind in Taiwan and adjacent areas.

The Research Museum develops cutting-edge information managing systems and online databases for the collections. Information on the Museum specimens can be accessed via periodically and provides guided museum tours to students, teachers, and general public, both domestic and overseas.

Museum of Institute of Ethnology

In 1955, Dr. Ling Shun-Sheng, the head of preparatory office of Institute of Ethnology, led a research team ahead Tjalljaqavus Village (current Lai-yi village, Pingtung County, Taiwan) to study Pawan culture and collect ethnographic artifacts, which is the beginning of the museum's collection.

After that, the collection of the museum steadily grew with the addition of artifacts amassed from expanding research and by now has reached the amount more than 7,000 pieces, including artifacts from Taiwan's indigenous group, Han Chinese folk and religious artifacts, and artifacts from Mainland China, Southeast Asia and the Pacific, etc.

Fu Ssu-Nien Memorial Room

Fu Ssu-nien (1896-1950) was the founder of the Institute of History and Philology at Academia Sinica, a forerunner of the "New Historical Studies", and one of the leaders in the May Fourth New Culture Movement. The Fu Ssu-Nien Memorial Room is a depiction of his lifelong achievements, and showcases letters from his friends and items belonging or pertaining to him. The permanent exhibition divides Fu's life into four major stages: 1) Fu Ssu-nien's youth and study abroad, 2) Fu Ssu-nien's return to China to the War of Resistance against Japan, 3) the Chinese War of Resistance against the Japanese and 4) Fu Ssu-nien's later life. Materials are chosen for each of the stages and pertinent explanations are provided so as to systematically connect the important events in Fu Ssu-nien's life and to display his work in promoting the establishment of the Institute of History and Philology.

Tsai Yuan-Pei Memorial Hall

Yuan-Pei Tsai (1868-1940), was entirely given up to education, and cultural research. From the end of the Qing dynasty to the beginning of the Republic of China period, he travelled to Europe twice, where he buried himself in studying and learning new things. During this period, he stayed mostly in Germany and France. He was nurtured by the scientific spirit after the Renaissance of Europe and the currents of thought following the French Revolution. He had a deep understanding on Germany and France's thinking, cultures, religions, morals, educational concepts and systems. The study tours had a big impact on his work and helped him chair the national educational administration, reform Peking University and direct the foundation of Academia Sinica.

Tsai Yuan-Pei Memorial Hall was established in 1960. The former residence building also served the purpose of the Academia Convocation and current affairs committee for Academia Sinica. At the beginning of 2014, the hall was refurbished and renamed the "Faculty Club." The Tsai Yuan-Pei Archive is located on the 1st floor of the building.

Wu Ta-You Memorial Hall

Dr. Ta-You Wu (1907-2000) was a renowned scholar in contemporary China and an internationally acclaimed physicist. Dr. Wu taught at Peking University and Southwest United University in China, National Research Council of Canada and State University of New York at Buffalo. Later he served as the director of the Institute of Physics at Academia Sinica. He is thus regarded as the father of contemporary Chinese physics. After Dr. Wu's passing away in 2000, the Institute of Physics at Academia Sinica established the Wu Ta-You Memorial Hall, which is located on the 4th floor of the institute's building. Dr's statue, books, manuscripts, photographs and documentary films are exhibited. Also on display is Dr's private collection, his office and living room during his tenure as the director of the Institute of Physics.

Hu Shih Memorial Hall

The Hu Shih Memorial Hall is located at the site of Dr. Hu's residence on the campus of the Academia Sinica in Nankang, where he lived while serving as its 3rd President from 1958 to 1962. The Memorial Hall was launched on December 10 following his sudden death on February 24, 1962. In 1965, an exhibition room next to the residence was built with the NT\$200,000 donated by his friend Mr. C.V. Starr. Later the Academia Sinica and the Taipei City Government collaborated to construct a park named after him. The Hu Shih Park where his grave is nearby was completed in February 1974.

The western side of the park passes through a drier monoculture bamboo plantation which is a remnant of earlier settlements.
